Part I: Annotate your book. Underline, highlight, ask questions, and make comments that demonstrate critical thinking. Ideally, annotations occur naturally as thoughts or questions arise, so there are no requirements like “two per page.” However, you should hold yourself to the highest standard of excellence as you complete your annotations, and I expect there to be consistent annotations through the length of the book.

Part II:

- A. Choose **two chapters** from the book that you find interesting.
- B. Visit the following website and watch the video to help you understand your task. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2y9GlmOPT2w> . **You do not have to make a video.** But you do have to create the script and drawings.
- C. Create 1) a summary explanation (or script) of each chapter (2 total) and 2) expository drawings that accompany the explanation of your chapter.
- D. For each of the two summary explanations write between 200-300 words. Think about the drawing that will accompany your explanation as you write (the script). You should imagine that every two-four sentences will accompany a specific drawing.
- E. With each chapter summary, draw pictures that will help to explain it.
 - a. **Each chapter summary should have a series of 6-8 drawings.**
 - b. Think about key ideas, concepts, and vocabulary that are worthy of drawing.
 - c. Each drawing should be labeled (#1, #2, ect).
 - d. Each drawing should have a detailed, colored, **hand-drawn picture.**
 - e. Drawings may be words or symbols, so long as they take on an artistic component (bubble letters, for example).
 - f. The 6-8 drawings should fit on 1-2 pieces of 8.5 by 11 inch printer paper.
